

UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY PROGRAMME

OUTGOING MOBILITY OF POST-DOC RESEARCHERS (Category B) Call for applications¹

Art. 1 - Scope

The university wishes to encourage the mobility of Post-doc researchers of the University of Verona to carry out study or research activities at a foreign institution. Stays abroad must be of not less than **one month** (30 consecutive days).

The mobility period must be carried out and concluded <u>during the normal period of enrolment/service</u>.

Mobility stays must take place during the period from the publication date of this notice until 31 March 2024.

Those who have already benefitted twice from a mobility grant within the last three editions (2018-2019-2020) cannot submit their application.

Art. 2 - Grant value

Postdoc researchers may spend a <u>continuous</u> period of **not less than one month (30 days)** at a foreign institution. However, the stay abroad can be longer than the funded period.

Funds granted will be paid to beneficiaries in the form of a post-graduate research scholarship.

Art. 3 - Resources available

The total available budget amounts to €10,000.

Art. 4 - Applications

Each applicant should proceed as follows:

- 1. Fill out the application form online;
- 2. upload the required attachments (in electronic format only). Specifically:

- 3. Submit the application by clicking on "send", then immediately after, continue by clicking on "print the answers" and "export to PDF" to save a copy of the application.
- 4. Send or drop off a copy of the application, including all the attachments, to the administration office of the Department, by the same deadline specified for the online application.

The deadline for completing and submitting applications is 31 May 2023, 12:00 noon.

Applications that are incomplete or received after the deadline, even in part, will not be accepted.

Art. 5 - Selection criteria

Selections will be made based on the following **selection criteria**:

4	Applications from candidates who have never benefitted from university funds for the international outgoing mobility initiative.	1 point
5	Co-funding quota in relation to the maximum amount that can be awarded (60% = 3 points; 50% = 2 points; 30% = 1 point)	0 - 3 points

In order to assess the international reputation of the host institution, the following criteria shall apply:

^{- &}lt;u>Universities.</u> The assessment will be based on the *QS World University Rankings* as available on the relevant website: http://www.topuniversities.com. The University's Selection Committee will calculate the arithmetic mean of two scores awarded according to the position of the university in the general QS rankings (among the top 100 universities: 3 points; from 101 to



200: 2 points; from 201 downwards: 1 point; no QS ranking: 0) and in the relevant macro-area (among the top 100 universities: 3 points; from 101 to 200: 2 points; from 201 downwards: 1 point; no QS ranking: 0).

- <u>Non-University institutes</u> e.g. a national institute of research or *Graduate Schools* (which are not generally taken into account in the QS international rankings). For this type of institutes only, the University's Selection Committee shall award 0 – 3 points **based on the reference letters/paperwork submitted by the applicant.**

Art. 6 - Ranking lists

After the deadline of 31 May 2023, the Departments will assess the mobility projects and draw up a list of eligible applicants. Each application shall be allocated a score in whole numbers or decimal multiples of 0.5, and no equal scores shall be allowed. Applicants cannot be appointed as members of the Selection Committees.

Every Department shall then send to the Research Office by **30 June 2023** the ranking list of assessed applications, together with **a copy of the minutes of the selections**, and **a copy of each individual evaluation sheet** duly and correctly completed, or else the application shall not be accepted.

<u>Subsequently</u>, the University's Selection Committee will meet to draw up the general ranking list on the basis of the selection criteria set out in Art. 5. **The ranking list of funded projects** be published after approval by the relevant University's bodies, likely by the end of July 2023.

Art. 7 - Supporting the mobility of female researchers

As provided for by the university's Gender Equality Plan, Thematic Area 1 "Work-life balance and organisational culture", an additional amount will be awarded to female researchers travelling with children under 6 years of age. For this category, a one-off grant of EUR 500 will be awarded - in addition to the amount granted - from available resources (EUR 10,000).

Art. 8 - Final report

Within 40 days of the end of the mobilities, each beneficiary will need to submit a final report, by means of the relevant form available online, or else the applicant will be excluded from taking part in the next Calls for international outgoing mobilities.
