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Choosing courses

Erasmus students must choose **at least 50%** of their course modules in the field of study defined in the bilateral agreement. Students should take **the other 50%** of their course modules in **no more than two other fields of study** (example: 50% of courses in the Department of German Philology, 25% of courses in the Department of History and 25% of courses in the Department of Politics).

The Faculties of Business Administration, Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine, Pharmacy do not accept students outside of their own inter-Institutional agreements.
