Application procedure	<p>The partner university nominates the selected students by email (internationaloffice.hum@uu.nl). Students will then receive an email with a link to an online application system. Students are asked to complete the online application and upload additional documents (certified transcript, language proficiency form, copy of passport/ID, course form).</p> <p>Students who wish to enroll in Master-level courses must prove that they have (or soon will) completed their Bachelor degree.</p>	
Language Requirements	<p>Students who are not native in English will be asked to provide a Language Proficiency Form (provided by UU). At the time of the application, students must be able to prove the following levels according to CEFR: For Bachelor level: B2 For Master level: C1</p> <p>Students wishing to enroll in courses taught in Dutch, German, French, Spanish or Italian, will be asked to provide a Language Proficiency Form for that language as well (same levels as above).</p>

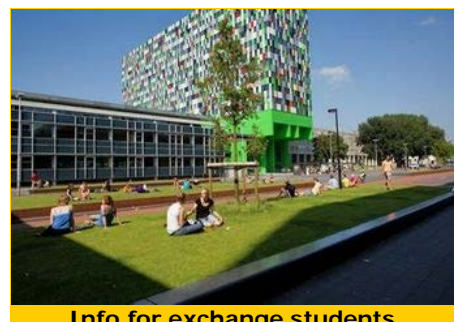
