#### **RESIDENCE PERMIT**

Students from EU/EEA countries do not need to apply for a residence permit, but must register with the police after arrival in Norway.

Nationals of **non-EEA countries** must apply for a student residence permit. One of the requirements is that the applicant must document access to approx. NOK 104 000 for one academic year (10 months) or NOK 52 000 for one semester. As the Norwegian Directorate of Immigration (UDI) is strict about the financial guarantee, the amount must be transferred to a student deposit account administered by UiS as soon as possible before applying for a permit. Detailed information regarding the deposit will be sent together with the Letter of Admission.

#### **ACCOMMODATION**

Due to the difficult housing situation in the Stavanger area the UiS cannot guarantee housing to all international students, but in recent years all students who apply within the deadline are offered a room in the dormitories. Students who apply after the deadline will not be prioritized. Students will be provided a link to apply in the Letter of Admission.
