<p>How to get to KSH</p>	<p><u>By plane:</u> Munich airport „Franz-Joseph-Strauß“ (https://www.munich-airport.com/) Memmingen airport (https://www.allgaeu-airport.com/) - 1 ½ hours bus ride to Munich city center</p> <p><u>By train:</u> Train Station Munich (www.bahn.de) Train Station Benediktbeuern (www.bahn.de)</p> <p><u>By bus:</u> Munich central bus station (www.muenchen-zob.de/en)</p> <p>Please note that for travelling to Benediktbeuern using plane/bus/train, you always need to pass Munich.</p>
<p>Public Transportation</p>	<p>Munich: public transportation ticket / one semester costs €193. www.mvv-muenchen.de/en/homepage/index.html</p> <p>Benediktbeuern: There is no public transportation needed. Train ticket one way to Munich costs €14,60 www.bahn.com/en/view/index.shtml</p>
<p>How to find Accommodation</p>	<p>The KSH supports international students to find housing but cannot guarantee for Munich since the housing market is very stretched.</p>
<p>Cost of Accommodation</p>	<p>Munich: Costs range between € 300 – € 400 for a room in a student dormitory and about € 600 on the free market (e.g. shared housing)</p> <p>Benediktbeuern: €200 – €300 in a student dormitory / shared housing.</p>
