



Prof. **Roberto Flor** (PhD, label Doctor Europaeus - Associate Professor of Criminal Law at the University of Verona) is specialised in Criminal Law and, in particular, in Cybercriminality (Cybercrime Law, Data Protection Law & Cybersecurity Law), Artificial Intelligence and Criminal Law, Technological Investigations, Corporate Criminal Law, Criminal Protection of IP rights, European Criminal Law and Comparative Criminal Law.

(*Germany*: Max Planck Institut für ausländisches und internationales Strafrecht, Freiburg im Breisgau; Max Planck Institut für Geistiges Eigentum, Wettbewerbs und Steuerrecht, Muenchen; *U.K.*: Cambridge University, Centre for IP and Information Law; *U.S.A.*: Washington College of Law, American University, Washington DC) and won the Italian “Ettore Gallo” Prize with the book on “Criminal Copyright Protection and Technological Protection Measures in the Era of Internet” (Cedam-Wolters Kluwer, 2010).

He spent also a period by the European Anti-Fraud Office (2008), Brussels (to conduct research on “New forms of offences to the Communities’ financial interests committed through the Information Technologies in comparative perspective).

He has been Italian Expert on Cybercrime Law by European and International Institutions and Scientific Responsible or Member in several national and international research projects.

He has published more than 140 scientific works (in Italian, Spanish, English and Portuguese) and is member of several scientific or editorial boards of scientific reviews and journals.

He is speaker at many national and international conferences, in Italy and abroad (particularly in Germany, France, The Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Albania, Kosovo, Turkey, Russia, U.S.A. and Mexico)

Since 2020 he is *President* of the Regional Section of Veneto of the Italian Society for Intelligence.
