Nomination deadlines	Until May 15th for the first/fall semester or full year Until October 31st for the second/spring semester
Specifications	We accept both undergraduate and graduate students. Depending on the department, some Master 1 & 2 courses are not open to exchange students. All the common fields are open except for the Medicine department, unless specified in the agreement.
Number of students	It depends on the agreement signed between our universities.
Language requirements	A B1 level in French is required and a B2 level is highly recommended. - A certificate from your university or professor is accepted. - DELF Diploma (https://www.ciep.fr/en/delf-tout-public) of the current year: B1 may be accepted level but it is strongly recommended to get B2 level. - TCF test certificate (http://www.ciep.fr/en/tcf/index.php): B1 level may be accepted but it is strongly recommended to get B2 level.
	Note: students who are native speakers do not need to submit the language proficiency test. <i>Please note that for the LLSHS faculty, non-Erasmus students need to be proficient in French and get at a B1 level (DELF Diploma is mandatory) in French language, in accordance to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages CEFR* to follow courses in "Licence" (Undergraduate) and a B2 (DELF Diploma is mandatory) for "Master" (Graduate) courses. Non-Erasmus students must have a video conference interview with a professor of LLSHS in order to be admitted.</i>

Preparatory language courses	One French intensive week (18 hours) at the beginning of each semester. Groups are formed according to level (A2 to C1 in accordance with the CECRL) following an assessment test. USPN also offers French classes throughout both semesters.

Credits	Please note that a student can get 30 credits (ECTS - European Credit Transfer System) for a full semester, and 60 credits for a full year. The number of credits required to validate the mobility will be fixed by the sending institution and the student.

Documents required for upload on the MoveOn platform	Learning agreement, Official transcripts of academic records, statement of purpose, letter of recommendation from the course leader, a proof of French proficiency, Curriculum vitae, Copy of Passport, student card from your university. Please note that the Online Learning Agreement will be signed once the student's application is finalized and accepted.

Orientation	A welcome meeting is organized at the beginning of each semester, followed by the French Intensive class. Please note that we propose the Tandem program: language and cultural exchange program which also allow the international student to meet and exchange with French students.

Accommodation	To be able to benefit from accommodation, the student must indicate on the Application Form their wish to have a Crous room. Crous Créteil allocates rooms according to their available spaces. Between 350 and 550 €.
Insurance	Exchange students will have to be insured (accident, disease, civil responsibility). Students under 28 have to subscribe to the student social security (free of charge).
Visa requirements	<p>Type-D student visa.</p> <p>Please note that students must register with Etudes En France - Campus France office (online application process*) to apply for admission and obtain a visa.</p> <p>Either they register in the website "Etudes en France" with our letter of acceptance; section "je suis accepté" or they will automatically receive an email from this application when they are accepted and nominated by us in this application.</p> <p>*https://pastel.diplomatie.gouv.fr/etudesenfrance/dyn/public/authentification/login.html</p>
