### Visa/Entry and Residence Requirements

Type of Visa / Residence Permit	<ul> <li>EU-, EEA- and CH-Citizens who fulfil the requirements of sufficient financial funds and proof of health insurance valid in Austria do not need a visa.</li> <li>"Third country Students" who are taking part in an mobility programme (e.g. Erasmus+) or for whom an agreement between two or more higher education institutions is in place and who are in possession of a valid residence title "Student" of another EU member country (except the Ireland and Denmark) are allowed to enter Austria without requiring a visa and to stay in Austria for up to 360 days.</li> <li>"Third country nationals" are required to have an entry or residence permit. The type of permit is dependent on the length and purpose of the stay. For stays up to</li> </ul>
	threes months (Japan: up to six months), entry and residence visas are not required from citizens of selected countries*.
