	GERMAN COURSES (free of charge when enrolled at Cologne University), either Pre-semester course: March resp. Sept. (4 weeks intensive German course, highly recommended) or Semester course (during the lecture period)
Study plan	Students can select and combine courses from all clinical semesters as listed in our course catalogue. As a result, it is sometimes unavoidable that lectures overlap. Clinical rotations ("Famulaturen") in the hospitals can be organised by the students themselves while they are in Cologne. Availability depending on capacities in the clinics.
