## **On-Campus**

University of Galway has a small number of on-campus beds dedicated to our Erasmus Students. To ensure a fair process, we will be holding a lottery for these beds.

Students must have been nominated and applied by April 30th to be entered into the lottery.

We emphasize the importance of students exploring the option of private accommodation in the meantime. Most students (across domestic, international and study abroad) live off-campus in private accommodation. Many students live on the outskirts of the city and commute via public transport. Because this is the usual practice, we are well set up to help students source off-campus accommodation.

We regret that, apart from this, the university is not able to reserve accommodation for incoming Erasmus students. *All accommodation enquiries should be directed to the Accommodation Advisory Service*.

University of Galway's Accommodation Advisory Service offers advice and assistance.

University of Galway has a purpose-built portal for off-campus accommodation called Studentpad.
