Mobility Grants

Within Europe, student exchanges take place in the context of the EU Programme Erasmus+ in the fields of education, training, youth, and sport. Since the academic year 2014/15, Switzerland has been providing grants for incoming and outgoing students and staff within the framework of the «Swiss-European Mobility Programme» (SEMP, formerly Erasmus). However, procedures and conditions remain the same.

Grants are issued under the SEMP mobility programme. These amount to CHF 1430 or CHF 2000 per semester, depending on the length of the exchange programme and the country of origin of the student's Higher Education Institution for a study semester. For traineeships the grants amount to CHF 440 per month, calculated on the basis of the effective internship days.

Greener Mobility

Students who travel by train or bus for both their outbound and inbound journeys are eligible to receive a one-time supplementary financial support of 100 CHF for each mobility.

Within the framework of SEMP, our exchange programme contains the following possibilities:

- **studies:** a SEMP exchange lasting between 60 days and 12 months.
- **traineeships:** a SEMP exchange lasting between 60 days and 12 months.
- **a combination** of studying and completing a traineeship (minimum duration of stay: 60 days)

Languages

As most of the courses at the university are conducted in German, the student must have strong German skills in order to be eligible to apply. For traineeships, the required German language level may vary and shall therefore be decided on a case-to-case basis. For more detailed information, see the table above.

Living and Accommodation

It is the student's responsibility to organize their accommodation during their stay in Switzerland. The International Office can support the student with finding housing in the region of Bern. However, the International Office does not guarantee accommodation for exchange students. Useful links can be found [here](#).

The living costs in Switzerland are high. The monthly expenses including food, accommodation, transport, and entertainment, and varies between CHF 1400 and 2100. Erasmus students also have the possibility to be assigned a buddy.

In Switzerland, the standard work week is 42h. Both regular and incoming students are subject to the rules and regulations of the host institution. BFH recommends the practice organisation to compensate placements financially. However, practice organisations are not obliged to pay out any financial compensation to the students.
