

Language requirements	Students should have a level of English Proficiency of at least CEF
(English)	B2/C1, IELTS 6,5 (with a minimum of 6.0 for each section) or
	TOEFL iBT 92 (with a minimum of 20 for each section) (paper
	based 580)

Recommended	SSH
organization	The University of Groningen is not a campus university, students
	have to find their own accommodation somewhere in town.
	International students can get assistance in finding accommodation
	from SSH.
	SSH does not have capacity to accommodate all international
	students and SSH is fully booked every semester. We advise
	students to apply early.
Other options	If students do not wish to make use of the accommodation offered
	by SSH and want to try finding housing on their own, they should
	take the following into account:
	* Make sure to do this through official websites or companies that
	can be traced;
	* Do not go to a viewing alone;
	* Do not pay anything before having everything in writing;
	* Always ask for a payment receipt;
	* A rent that is too low for the location or type of housing as well as
	unrecognizable pictures of the location may indicate fraudulent
	practices;
	* Avoid identity theft: never send a passport copy to strangers.
