- Nomination by partner prior to deadline
- Online application
- Proof of English language proficiency, *Non-EU students only*
- Transcript of records

- Orientation information

Application Entry Requirements

Undergraduate students need at least one year of university-level studies with at least one semester/30 ECTS within Business Administration. Graduate students must submit a copy of their bachelor's degree.

Language Requirements

Nominated students are expected to be highly proficient in English (spoken and written) in order to have a successful learning experience.

Non-EU students: TOEFL-paper: 550, TOEFL-computer: 213, TOEFL-internet: 80 (Writing: 20, Speaking: 20, Reading: 20 and Listening: 20), IELTS: 6.5 or higher (no subtest less than 6.0 in the Academic Module), Cambridge ESOL; C1 Advanced (CAE), minimum overall score 180.

Accommodation

Due to the popularity of studying in Stockholm, *housing through the university cannot be guaranteed.*

Students admitted to our exchange programme will receive application instructions for housing. The cost per semester for a room in shared accommodation is ca 22,500 SEK - 40,000 SEK and for a studio apartment ca 32,500 SEK - 54,500 SEK. Rent for the semester is paid in two installments.

Academics

Full-time studies correspond to 30 ECTS per semester which consists of four 7.5 ECTS courses.

Students select the courses they wish to take in their online application. A minimum of two courses (50%) has to be at Stockholm Business School.

If students wish to take courses at other departments within the university they must indicate this in their online application. Courses at other departments cannot be guaranteed and might not be confirmed until one week before the semester starts.

- One semester = 20 weeks, divided into four parts (A, B, C, D)
- Orientation week is held the week before the start of the fall semester and the same week as the start of the spring semester.

Swedish grading system ECTS grade A, B, C, D, E or F:
Pass with Distinction A (90-100 course points)
Pass with Distinction B (80-89 course points)
Pass C (70-79 course points)
Pass D (60-69 course points)
Pass E (50-59 course points)
Fail F (0-49 course points)
