Once nominated for exchange at NIH by their home institution, the students must complete their application in the online application portal used by NIH. All the courses included in the course packages for our inbound exchange students are taught in English.

It is possible for students with a sufficient command of the Norwegian/Swedish/Danish language (minimum CEFR B2 level) to take courses taught in Norwegian.



Student Housing

NIH offers a limited number of guaranteed housing units per semester to our inbound exchange students for a fee. This offer is provided through an agreement with [Student Welfare Organization SIO](#), the largest provider of student services in the area.

All the students who have received and accepted their offer of admission to NIH will receive an email with detailed information on how to pay the non-refundable fee and apply for housing.

How to apply?

The students and staff members that are interested in enrolling into one or more online courses at NIH must be nominated by their home institution in the same way as the students nominated for physical exchange.

Please contact the international office at the home university if you would like to participate in our online courses. When students have been nominated, they will receive further information on how to complete their applications in the same application portal that is used by NIH for inbound physical exchange students.

How many courses can you take?

The online exchange courses at NIH offer a high degree of flexibility both in their teaching form, as well as the number our students can take. The students enrolled in our online courses can choose anything from a singular course up to all the courses in the package, based entirely on their own capacity and interest for the course offerings.

We offer both courses in English and Norwegian. Our Nordic students speaking a Scandinavian language can also enroll into the Norwegian-taught online courses.
