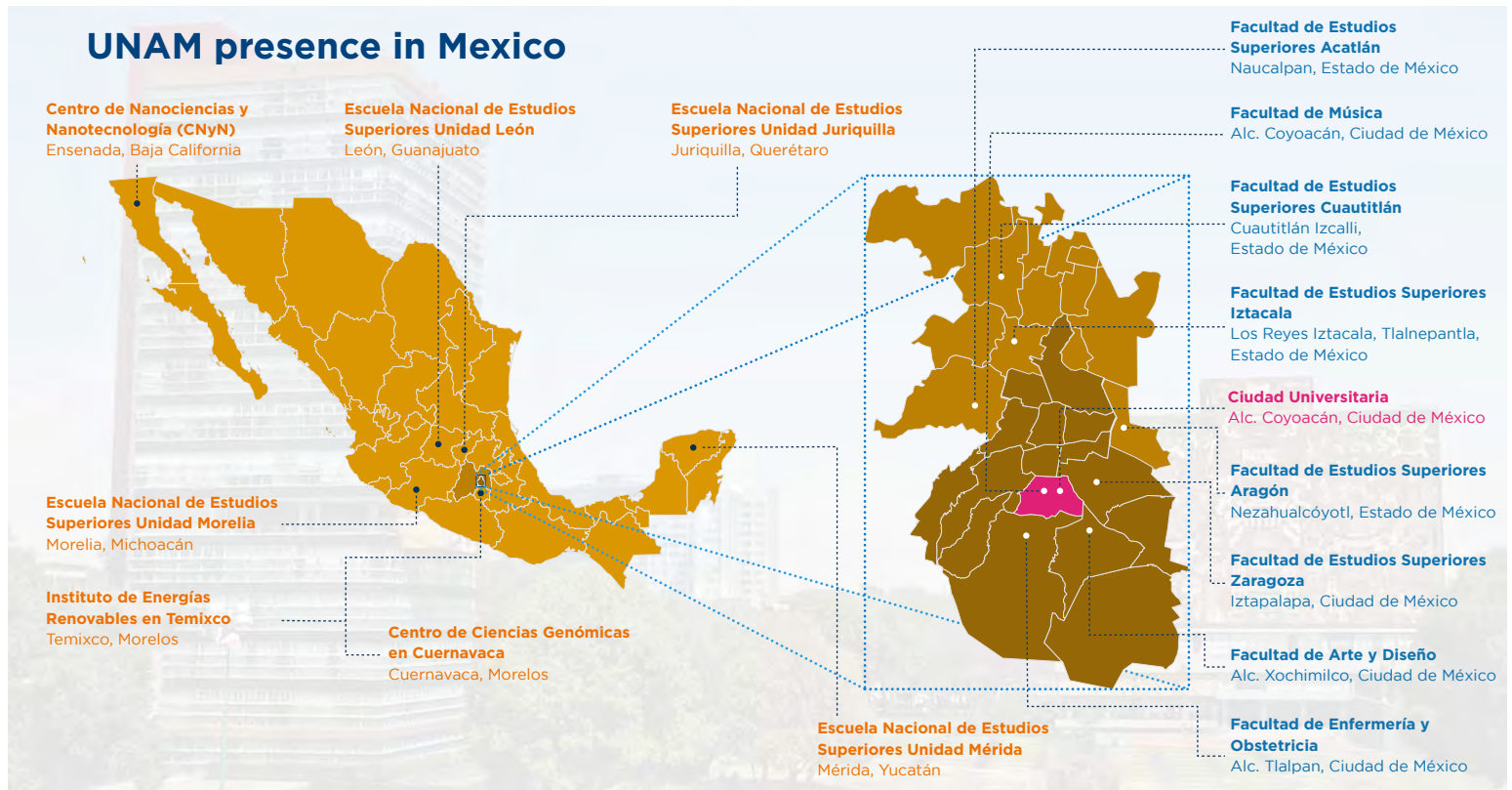

Mobility application procedure

Nomination and application process is through the Administration System of Incoming Student's Mobility (by its initials in Spanish "SGMEE"). Access must be guaranteed to log in the System and nominate students (verify the corresponding call).

1. The International Office from the HEI begins with the nomination procedure through SGMEE.
2. The student will fill in with the required information and will upload the required documentation including:
 - a. An institutional **application letter** issued by the student's university supporting the request.
 - b. An **official certificate** of Spanish language proficiency, **level B2** (SIELE or DELE), when it applies.

The general requirements and those requested by the schools and faculties (Specific requirements) are established into the call. The **registration instructions** will be available at DGEI website together with the publication of the call.

With the objective of supporting and guiding the mobility coordinators of each HEI and interested students, the DGEI offers informative sessions that will help to solve questions regarding the procedure for nominations, applications, among other topics. The dates of each session will be informed in the call.

Official Language

Courses are taught in Spanish. However, there are some courses given in English. For further information about courses in English, please click here:

- For students whose native or instruction language is different from Spanish, an international official Spanish Certificate in a B2 level CEFR (as minimum) is required.
- DELE Certificate (Instituto Cervantes) or SIELE Certificate (Servicio Internacional de Evaluación de la Lengua Española) are the only certificates accepted.
- SIELE tests can be found all over the world. The required certificate from SIELE are the 4 tests on "SIELE GLOBAL" Certification or the S5 SIELE modality (includes Written Expression and Interaction & Oral Expression and Interaction). - Through the Teaching Center for Foreigners (CEPE), interested students will be able to take an online preparation course and take the SIELE exam in the S5 modality. These courses are exclusive for mobility candidates, offered at a preferential cost. Check the links to the courses in the call published on the DGEI website or request information from the Incoming Student Mobility Coordination.
- For courses in English or other language, you must comply with the requirement determined by the corresponding academic entity.

Visiting Student

For visiting students with no university agreement, enrollment fees are:

- Tuition fee: \$250 USD.
- Semestral fee per assignment: \$275 USD.

Major Medical Health Insurance

Once students are admitted, they must acquire an International Major Medical Health Insurance. The insurance is compulsory to undertake their mobility stay and must be acquired in their home country before traveling to Mexico and must be registered in the SGMEE system.

The insurance must be valid during the complete mobility stay in Mexico. The insurance coverage must include accidents, medical attention for any type of illness, diverse medical support services, major medical health expenses, hospitalization, COVID-19 sickness and hospitalization, and repatriation of mortal remains. The insurance is not managed nor acquired through UNAM.

Likewise, upon arrival, the students must pay a fee for an accident insurance (Field Practices) managed by UNAM (the cost is approximately \$220 Mexican pesos).

Lodging

There is no residence available for international students. Admitted students can consult approved lodging options by CEPE near the university campus. Students must register on:

Immigration Checkpoint in Mexico

Students must have a residence permit or a visa to study in Mexico. They must consult the corresponding Embassy or Consulate for further information about the procedure to obtain the adequate migratory status.

- Nourishment: 350 to 450
- Transportation: 40 to 60
- Studying materials: the materials vary depending on the degree

UNAMigo program

UNAMigo Program offers support to our international and national students to get along with our volunteer UNAM students. Our local students will be their hosts during their stay. They will guide them along the campus, assist them in the school or faculty enrollment or other services, guide them about local transportation or food and accompany them in recreational and cultural activities offered by UNAM, DGEI or the schools or faculties in which they will carry out their mobility. To join the program they will be contacted prior arrival at UNAM.



Spanish language and Mexican culture courses for mobility students Teaching Center for Foreigners (CEPE)

Students are entitled to a discount on Spanish and Mexican culture courses. These courses are independent of the mobility program they are participating in. At the end of the course, students receive an evaluation document.

Language courses National School of Languages, Linguistics and Translation (ENALLT)
