APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1 NOMINATION

Exchange students are nominated through the International Office of their home university. Once their nomination has been confirmed by AMU, online application has to be submitted as per deadlines above.

Step 2 ONLINE APPLICATION

Complete the online application on AMU's mobility portal.

The documents listed on the next page have to be submitted.

Step 3 ADMISSION

After the application has been screened and accepted, students will receive an admission letter as well as "the welcome package" with all necessary practical information.

- ✓ Language proficiency certificate or certificate signed by university teacher:
 - For courses delivered in French: B1 (TCF/DELF/DALF) please note that FSL Department (FLE) courses require a C1 in French
 - For courses delivered in English (open to English Majors only): C1 (TOEFL/TOEIC/IELTS)
- ✓ Cover Letter
- Learning agreement (courses at AMU preselected by nominated students): Students must choose at least 1 course (6 credits) in the field of study for which the Erasmus bilateral agreement was signed. Additionally ,students can choose courses from other fields of study within the humanities faculty.
- **✓** Proof of ID
- ✓ European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC)



COURSES OPEN TO EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Courses Open to Exchange Students at the Arts, Languages and Humanities Faculty

You can choose classes among dozens of courses with the Arts departments (Cinema, theatre and music), the French departments (Litterature, classics, linguistics), the Languages departments (over fifteen languages including Applied Foreign languages), and the Humanities departments (History, History of Art and Archeology, Geography, Sociology, Philosophy, Psychology, Anthropology, Education Sciences, European Studies...). ALLSH also offers courses specifically aimed at international students on exchange programmes including French courses and European society and history courses.

There will also be a selection of English Taught Courses aimed specifically at English major students (C1 in English required).

Aix-Marseille is currently reveiwing the structure and credits of all its courses - a full and detailed catalogue will be available in the coming months. Learning Agreements will therefore be based on the degree programmes listed below:

HEALTH MEASURES

COVID-19 seems to be behind us. However, we still recommend that students check conditions for entering France before departure as they may vary according to their country of origin and their vaccination status.

As part of the French tuberculosis prevention plan, incoming sudents from the UK and Türkiye will be contacted by the University's Student Health Service (SSE) to schedule a chest X-ray.

TRANSPORTATION

ARRIVAL BY PLANE


The closest airport to Aix-en-Provence and Marseille is MARSEILLE-PROVENCE AIRPORT located approximatively 20 miles away from Aix and Marseille. Students will be able to use a shuttle service to get to both cities.

ARRIVAL BY TRAIN

There are two different train stations (gare) in Aix-en-Provence:

- the Gare SNCF Aix Centre-Ville is located in downtown Aix-en-Provence
- **AIX TGV** is the high speed train station located about 15 minutes by bus outside Aix-en-Provence.

Only one major train station is in Marseille: Gare SNCF Marseille Saint Charles.

ON CAMPUS HOUSING

Halls of residence in Aix-en-Provence or in Marseille: single room (10 m²) with bed, desk, chair, fridge, washbasin, shower and private toilet. Shared kitchen facilities in each building. To book their room students will be required to:



- Fill in the MoveOn and MesServicesEtudiants forms, taking special care to do so before deadlines
- Confirm their booking with a 100€ down payment
- Upload their proof of identity and housing insurance including personal liability
 NB: these documents must be in French
- Sign and upload their housing contract

>>> Upon their arrival

- Pay for their room for the whole semester at the frontdesk in the residence
- Pay a security deposit (refunded on departure on condition that the room is left in the same state in which it was rented)

NB. Cash payment is not accepted. Students should confirm with their bank that they can make international payments with their card.


