Language of	The main language of instruction at the University of Cologne is
instruction	German. However, students planning to study at our university do
	not necessarily have to be fluent in German before they come
	here. A range of subjects of the Faculty of Arts and Humanities
	regularly offers courses taught in English. Among these subjects
	are, for example, African Studies, Ethnology, Indology,
	Linguistics & Phonetics, Media & Cultural Studies, Oriental
	Studies, North American History, and Musicology. In addition
	to that, we offer study programmes that are entirely taught in
	English, i.e. English Studies (BA, MA), North American Studies
	(MA), and African Culture and Environment (MA)
Information about	At first sight, the ECTS-system in Cologne seems a bit confusing,
ECTS system	as there is no fixed amount of ECTS credits for each class.
	Instead, the students can receive different numbers of ECTS
	credits for the same class. This depends on whether they 'only'
	attend the class regularly, give an oral presentation, write an exam
	or hand in a term paper. The advantage of this system is that
	students can decide individually in consultation with the lecturers,
	how many ECTS they want to receive for each class.

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	Generally, one can say the following about most of the classes at the Faculty of Arts and Humanities:
	Lectures with attendance only: 1-2 ECTS 'Proseminar' with attendance only: 2 ECTS 'Proseminar' with oral presentation/exam: 3-4 ECTS 'Proseminar' with term paper: 4-5 ECTS 'Hauptseminar' with attendance only: 2 ECTS 'Hauptseminar' with oral presentation: 3-4 ECTS 'Hauptseminar' with term paper: 6 ECTS 'Übung/Kolloquium': 2-4 ECTS
	The students can find more information in the particular handbook of modules of their course of studies. Each course of studies in Cologne has such a handbook of modules, in which the students can see how many credits they may receive for each class, depending on the amount of work they choose to do for that specific class (e.g. presentation, term paper, etc.). The students can find the handbook of modules for each institute on the website of the respective institute/department or by searching it online.

Health Insurance	EU-Citizens: Students have to ask their home insurance company to issue a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for them, so that in case they fall ill they will be able to consult a doctor. The students are not required to provide a health insurance certificate to the University of Cologne. Non-EU-Citizens: Students are required to have a health insurance certificate in order to issue their residence permit. We advise students who already have a health care insurance to ask them whether their insurance sufficiently covers their stay abroad or not. Students are not required to provide a health insurance certificate
