


The University of Luxembourg

8,000 students are enrolled at Uni.lu, of which 1,100 are doctoral candidates. With 300 professors, students have privileged access to world-renowned expertise.


Times Higher Education ranks Uni.lu 20th in the Young University Ranking 2024 and among the top 250 universities in the world.
