**G ATHINE01**: Courses at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens are normally taught in Greek. For the incoming students that are not fluent in Greek, the NKUA requires good knowledge of the English language (Level B2) that allows students to communicate and function within an academic context.

Furthermore, there are courses in other languages, especially at the Foreign Language Departments (French, German, Italian etc.) and at the School of Law which offers courses in English, French and German language (<u>http://en.law.uoa.gr/erasmus.html</u>). The Department of Economics, the Department of Political Science and Public Administration and the Department of Communication and Media Studies offer a number of courses in English too. Some postgraduate courses are also taught in other languages (mainly in English). In all other Departments, at the moment, there are special arrangements for Erasmus+ students. The most common one is the assignment of essays in English with the use of English bibliography.

#### Modern Greek language courses

Courses are offered free of charge to Erasmus students who are registered at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens by the Modern Greek Language Teaching Centre. Courses are offered in both winter and spring semester (6 hours/week). Students that succeed in the examinations at the end of each semester **obtain 6 ECTS credits.
