Decision Response	Students will receive an acceptance e-mail within 5 weeks of the application deadline.			
Recommended Language Skills	Except for courses offered through Gaeilge (Irish), teaching is through English. We do not have a specific exam-based requirement for English, but students need to have a good command of both written and spoken English. We would suggest Level B2 on the <u>CEFR</u> . For incoming teaching staff, we would recommend Level C1 .

How many modules/credits can be taken in each semester?	Each class is weighted at 5 or 10 ECTS credits. You can take up to 30 ECTS credits per semester, which is a normal course load for University of Galway students.

English Classes	Our English Language Centre provides English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Workshops for all Erasmus students to develop their English-language skills. Please note that this course does not carry ECTS credits.

Accommodation

On-Campus

University of Galway has a small number of on-campus beds dedicated to our Erasmus Students. To ensure a fair process, we will be holding a lottery for these beds.

Students must have been nominated and applied by April 30th to be entered into the lottery.

We emphasize the importance of students exploring the option of private accommodation in the meantime. Most students (across domestic, international and study abroad) live off-campus in private accommodation. Many students live on the outskirts of the city and commute via public transport. Because this is the usual practice, we are well set up to help students source off-campus accommodation.

We regret that, apart from this, the university is not able to reserve accommodation for incoming Erasmus students. *All accommodation enquiries should be directed to the <u>Accommodation Advisory</u> <u>Service</u>.*

University of Galway has a purpose-built portal for off-campus accommodation called Studentpad.


