Grading System

The College sets the class of Degree that may be awarded at undergraduate level as follows:

- First: 70% or above for the average weighted module results
- Upper Second: above 60% but less than 70% for the average weighted module results
- Lower Second: above 50% but less than 60% for the average weighted module results
- Third: above 40% but less than 50% for the average weighted module results

The College classifies its awards at Postgraduate taught level (PG Cert, PG Dip, MA, MSc, MRes, MFA and LLM) as follows:

- Distinction: The student has achieved a result of 70% or above.
- Merit: The student has achieved a result of above 60% but less than 70%.
- Pass: The student has achieved a result of above 50% but less than 60%.

- 31 May 2019 for term 1 (Autumn) and full-year students
- 31 October 2019 for term 2 (Spring students)

Application

Erasmus exchange students must first check our list of partner institutions to find out if we have an agreement (download a copy of our partnership list, with details of relevant subject areas: www.bbk.ac.uk/downloads/international/erasmus-partner-institutions.pdf).

If we have a valid agreement with your university, you should contact your university's Erasmus coordinator in the first instance (contact details are on the partnership list), who will advise you if you are eligible to apply. Once we receive your nomination, we will send you an application form to complete.

Your application should be submitted together with your proposed learning agreement, to indicate the courses you intend to study. You must also provide the following documents (in English) to support your application:

- CV
- Recent academic transcript
- Copy of your IELTS results
- An academic reference in support of your application
- Copy of the photo page of your passport.

Enrolment

We will send you an email inviting you to enrol online if you have been formally accepted on a programme of study.

The email will contain your username and password; you will need to enrol by logging into My Birkbeck. This is your student account, which you can access with your username and password.





During enrolment you may be asked to upload ID documents; you will only need to do this at the start of your course. You will not be able to complete enrolment until your ID documents have been verified.
