# 1. The acoustics of compound stress

*Topics*: linear regression, discover relations between variables, modeling of acoustic properties

*Tasks*: plotting of sample measurements, discovering relationships between variables, preparation of next session with sample data codings

#### 2. Coding and measuring of the influence of structural and semantic factors

*Topics*: testing hypotheses about compound stress assignment based on speech corpus data, coding of factors, statistical modeling

Reading: Plag et al. 2008

*Tasks*: Coding of factors with sample data, making predictions, interpreting regression output

## 3. The role of the constituent family in compound stress assignment

*Topics*: psycholinguistic underpinnings, statistical modeling (logistic regression), theoretical implications

Reading: Plag et. al 2009

*Tasks*: stress placement as a function of informativeness, lexical decision latencies as a function of morphological family size
